Tatjana Đurišić-Bečanović is an associate professor at the University of Montenegro, where she is an expert in theory and interpretation of literature and Montenegrin literature. She worked at the Petar II Petrović Njegoš Institute (Montenegrin Academy of Sciences and Arts) as a Deputy Director. Prof. Bečanović is an authoress of four monographs and about 70 papers and articles published mainly in the international journals or international conference proceedings. Currently she is the President of the Organizing Committee of *Njegoševi dani*, an international Slavic gathering that has been held regularly in Montenegro since 2008 and is dedicated to the study and promotion of Njegoš's creativity, Montenegrin and other South Slavic literatures and cultures. Prof. Bečanović used to be a member of the Council for the Standardization of the Montenegrin Language, as well as the President of the Council for the Development of the Vocabulary of the Montenegrin Folk and Literary Language, guest lecturer at the Slavic Department in Oslo (2007), at the Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznań (doctoral studies, 2015), and at the Jagiellonian University in Kraków (2017). She also worked as a Vice Dean for Science and International Cooperation at the Faculty of Philosophy in the years 2005-2008, as well as a Vice Dean for Teaching and Postgraduate Master's and Doctoral Studies during the period from 2009 till 2012.
