Formatting instructions for authors

Studia Anglica Posnaniensia follows the **Unified Style Sheet for Linguistics**. Prospective authors are strongly encouraged to pre-format their manuscripts in compliance with the USSL, although it is not a prerequisite for considering the manuscript for publication. Once your manuscript has been accepted for publication, however, complying with at least the following aspects of the USSL will considerably speed up its preparation for publication:

1. StAP uses the Oxford comma

differences in generation, rank, attitude and style > differences in generation, rank, attitude, and style

2. StAP uses the en dash for page and year ranges

1918-1918 > 1914–1918

(Vance 2015: 198-199) > (Vance 2015: 198–199)

3. StAP encloses e.g. and i.e. in commas

polytraumas, i.e. the multiple injuries > polytraumas, i.e., the multiple injuries

4. The default format of a reference in the text is:

(AUTHOR YEAR: PAGE–PAGE) > (Vance 2015: 198–199)

5. The default format of a reference in the reference list follows the USSL. However, for books the place of publication is not given.
